Attacking two cycles at once

Most people know we have been helping divert prisoners' kids (PKs) from entering Detention through early intervention supports for over ten years. The 'Dropping off the Edge' DOTE2015 research, has identified every postcode in every State where the largest numbers of generational crime patterns have emerged. In Adelaide, the highest number of PKs are in the southern and northern suburbs.

The first cycle is **generational offending** where children are exposed to antisocial behaviours, discouraged to achieve and be successful in life and are influenced by negative peers. Often truanting is the

beginning of a downhill slide. Following a parent into prison can be easier than pursuing a crime free purposeful life. We're addressing this cycle by reaffirming their worth through birthday and Christmas presents.

The second cycle is **welfare dependency.** This mostly comes about when no one under their roof demonstrates a work ethic by going to work each day. The concept of earning money for an honest day's work is not common. As parents and sometimes grandparents, don't work yet survive on welfare payments then perhaps they can too.

Attacking two cycles at once is a strategy we know will have strong protective factors. As you travel with us, we will be reporting transforming stories. We have just two years to change lives forever. Join us.

We've opened two hubs where Life Coaches are connecting with and enrolling participants between 16 – 25 years.

We're helping them overcome obstacles to employment and training. We're introducing them to Barista courses, First Aid courses and supporting their efforts to gain their driving licenses.

We have 'taken off' with eligible participants and already the vision, the hope and the planning we're providing, is seeing a change in attitude and direction for the first ten recruits.
