Vinning GOLD in Canberra!

Second Chances SA has won GOLD at the **2017 Australian Crime and Violence Prevention Awards (ACVPA)** in the community-led category in Canberra. The award comes in recognition of *'Prisoner's Kids: The Invisible Victims of a Crime.'* (Find the full report at www.secondchances.org.au/research).

The ACVPAs recognise best practice in the prevention or reduction of violence and other types of crime in Australia. The awards are coordinated by the **Australian Institute of Criminology (AIC)** and were presented by the **Hon Michael Keenan MP, Federal Minister for Justice.**

For **Second Chances SA CEO Helen Glanville**: "Winning the ACVPA is a momentous moment in bringing the plight of Prisoner's Kids out from the shadows ensuring they are no longer 'invisible' but are encouraged to choose positive life goals of their own."

Acting Director of the Australian Institute of Criminology, **Nicole Rose PSM** adds: "[This] is the only project of its kind in South Australia and possibly Australia, and is a big step in confronting the next generation of criminals."

Shining a light on the invisible victims of crime

When you're on an impacting mission which transforms young lives, diverting them from deep trouble, it's encouraging to receive the funds to continue our work till June 30 2019. Thanks to **DCSI** (Department for Communities and Social Inclusion), we have two full time operators visiting homes, supporting caregivers including 45 grandmothers, to help young at-risk children make positive plans for their future.

We have made great strides in early prevention but we have so much more to do. Winning the ACVP Gold Award in Canberra mid-October was a powerful and prestigious encouragement.

No government – Federal, State or Local, is taking responsibility

for prisoner's kids. It is estimated there are up to 60,000 children who nationwide have a parent in prison.

When a prisoner is admitted, it is not standard procedure, to ask them, 'Do you have dependents?"

Neither the police nor Child Protection staff, will or can, check on the prisoner's kids LEFT BEHIND if they don't ask, or don't know when a parent is incarcerated.

We break the cycle of crime by preventing them from truanting; they are often bullied at school.

We restore their dignity by giving them brand new school shoes and uniforms.

We deliver 10 PK Mentoring Camps each year and develop their leadership skills for good. **We** tell them they can make good choices for their own lives.

We give them birthday presents and Christmas presents so they are NOT forgotten.

We encourage them to join good sporting teams and good youth groups so they can have acceptance, belonging and value.

We divert them from a trajectory heading towards juvenile detention.

They CAN have a crime free future, if we get there early enough, before it's too late.

We're Back! PK Family Care is on the beat

Recently **bU Sisterhood at Influencers Church** had an appeal for backpacks containing the essentials for school. Who would have thought a backpack could be so important in the development of a child's education? It holds necessary lunch box and drink bottle, note books, pencils, pencil case, and ruler. Over 20 backpacks have been donated and these are ready to give to children who need them.



In early October we reformed the **PK Family Care** services with two full time staff operating from our offices in Salisbury. They're equipped with laptops in the field, linked to a CRM in the cloud, so they can record their data and case notes on the go. We're reviewing how we collect data so that by June 2019 we can assess how our efforts are achieving the transformational changes in attitudes, choices and behaviour in growing PKs. When a home visit is made the primary client is the child to ensure they are not neglected or bullied at school and are having the best chance to complete their education. When we see the need, we go shopping to buy school uniforms and shoes to help a child stop truanting. This restores their dignity and their hope for a good future.

We know where the PKs live and enter their postcode to fit their Local Government Area. When we approach Local Government for a community grant we ask for a partnership so we can have funds to reach the PKs living in their City. We have recently received funds from the **City of Playford** to purchase school uniforms and shoes for their PKs. There are 97 PKs living in their city. We hope to be working in other Local Government areas to help return dignity to PKs and hope to struggling families.
