Creativity is Contagious!



Even in these unique circumstances, the team continue to go above and beyond!



PK Family Care recently came across a mum of two teenagers in a tough predicament. After living without a fridge or freezer for over a month, PK Family Care and **Second Chances Furniture Warehouse** were able to help provide the family one.

After a rough couple of weeks of food insecurity, they're now able to store their own food at home safely without relying on their neighbour or school's fridges.

To say the mum is extremely grateful is an understatement as she did not know how they were going survive through the school holidays and social distancing measures, without their own fridge. This has restored safety and dignity to this vulnerable family.

Reaching the invisible victims of crime

The team provides home visits, school uniform packages, support, advocacy and agency referral — all with the goal of strengthening families and keeping PKs (prisoners' kids) out of the criminal justice system.

Steady as She Goes

We're steadying the ship, steering a course towards the shore and setting down our anchor until calm returns. We're taking stock of what we have and focusing on those we seek to serve – the families, children and youth of prisoners.

We've postponed our PK Mentoring Camps program and hopefully we'll be back to planning camps in the Spring.

We had a duty of care to our valued volunteers and customers, to temporarily close our Op Shop and Furniture Warehouse. We have continued to respond remotely to requests from housing agencies needing furniture for their clients. Housing for the homeless and victims of domestic violence is an essential service.

While weekly visiting of prisoners has ceased for the time being, we're working with the Department for Correctional Services to respond remotely to completing banking transactions for prisoners to stay connected to their families.

Our Chapel Services roster for Mobilong and Cadell is on 'pause'.

We continue to do the following:

- We <u>deliver</u> birthday presents to around 25 children of prisoners each month.
- We <u>connect</u> and encourage 'Getting Ready for Take Off' participants via scheduled online video coaching sessions to stay their course.
- We <u>engage</u> with families using all the technical tools at our disposal.
- We <u>support</u> children of prisoners and their caregivers with creative ideas through school holidays and enforced school 'downtime'.
- We <u>deliver</u> food hampers, donated art packs and restored bicycles with helmets.
- We <u>share</u> Good News stories daily across all four social media platforms.
- We <u>prioritise</u> the wellbeing and morale of staff as we look ahead and plan for change returning to a 'bright new world'.
- We <u>navigate</u> our way through the challenges we face and determine to set

out a framework which will see us ready to hit the ground running when we come through this season.

We are in this together and together we can continue to move forward because our confidence is in our purpose – restoring hope and giving 'second chances' to those impacted by the criminal justice system.

Our ship leaves the shore for new, uncharted waters, when we're free to sail full steam ahead.

Our families need to know you're with us all the way. Thank you for 'being there' and supporting us through this challenging time.

We will overcome - together.
