Christmas won't be the same this year. Low security prisons which usually host family fun days and Christmas parties, will not be going ahead due to health safe-guarding measures. For many families this is the one day in the year which feels a little bit 'normal,' spending some fun time with dad or mum; bouncy castle, carousel, running games on the grass, music from visiting bands and some special prizes and treats for the children.

While **Christmas Angel** presents will be delivered for the parent to give at Christmas visiting times

in December, we anticipate more deliveries to the child's home will be requested, due to the limited visiting times and long distances some families need to travel, especially to country prisons.

We love to see the joy on the faces of the children, especially seeing them run and play on the grass and in the sun while mum and dad look on as a family together. **Not their crime. Not their fault.**

The best feeling of happiness is when you're happy because you've made somebody else happy. We will do our best to report back to you the happiness you're making possible for the families torn apart by parental incarceration.

If you want happiness, start giving. Because the happiest people in life are givers, not the receivers.

Getting in early



Families who have lost a parent to prison, often feel a little lost. Someone they live with is no longer around. There's a vacant spot in the lounge room, and the children ask when they will see their missing parent again. When a child faces emotional trauma at home, they often play up at school and that's where we come in.

Second Chances Family Care workers Sarah and Alison, visit the children at home, and connect with their teachers at school, to help keep them focussed on their continuing education. In some instances, our team arrange private out-of-hours literacy and numeracy tutoring for young people at-risk of falling behind, thanks to a small grant from the Department of Education. For Alex*, having access to personalised tutoring has transformed him from a disengaged student to a young man engaged in his own future and hopeful for what it can look like.

For this important service to continue beyond 30 June 2021, we submitted

a tender to State Government in early October to deliver Intensive Family Services across Adelaide. Professional family services must always be delivered by professional staff who are recognised and respected by government departments and other agencies.



Diving into an ocean of opportunities



Ask **Sophie*** about clownfish or rays and watch her eyes light up. "I always knew I wanted to work with animals," she

says. Currently completing her final year of a Bachelor of Marine Biology and Aquaculture, Sophie is ready to kickstart her career.

Growing up, Sophie's home life can only be described as disruptive. With a dad addicted to drugs and her parents stuck in an unhealthy and abusive relationship, Sophie and her siblings found themselves

caught in the middle. "We only used to live a couple houses down from the school so everybody knew what was happening," Sophie says. "I didn't want anybody to think different of me because of my dad."

Since joining *Getting Ready for Take Off*, Sophie has already noticed changes within herself. "I've felt a lot less stressed financially," she shares. "My Life Coach is always there to talk to; providing support and encouraging me with reaching goals."

The future is bright for Sophie. She concludes university at the end of this year and has already been offered employment utilising her marine biology training.

In September, Zinedine stepped into the newly formed role of **Manager**, **Prison Ministry** coordinating volunteers and activities throughout eight prisons. Despite social distancing restrictions, Zinedine and his team of volunteers have continued to provide practical support through remote banking, property storage, and clothing packages.

The **2019/2020 FY** has been a one of growth, change, and adaptation across Second Chances SA. In our *Annual Report 2019-2020*, we are excited to share with you some of our highlights and achievements up until 30 June 2020, including:

- 210 Children received Birthday Stars presents on behalf of an imprisoned parent.
- 231 Second Chances Family Care home visits providing support to 46 families.
- **1,580 Bringing Hope** prisoner interactions across **875** volunteer hours.
- 34 camping opportunities provided across 4 Second Chances Mentoring Camps.
- **632** children and young people received **Christmas Angels** presents, on behalf of an imprisoned parent.
- 74 Getting Ready for Take Off participants currently engaged with 10 now employed!
