Independent Evaluators: Nova Smart Solutions and University of Queensland

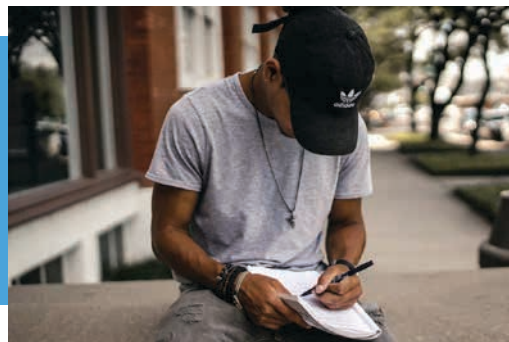

Evaluating our work



PARTICIPANT SURVEY RESULTS

1. **93%** stated they feel they have hope for their future.
2. **93%** stated their Life Coach is assisting them to achieve their Career Goals.
3. **86%** stated their work ethic has improved since being in the program.
4. **96%** stated their Life Coach has assisted them in overcoming barriers.
5. **97%** stated they have developed new skills for their future.
6. **83%** stated the program has improved their employment opportunities.
7. **87%** stated they are now employable.

Getting Ready for TAKE OFF

8. **79%** stated they receive support from family or carer.
9. **48%** stated they are currently looking for work as some are already employed or studying.
10. **96%** stated they are becoming good role models for their family members.
11. **82%** stated they have experienced a 3 Star rating on their overall experience. (They had a choice of 1- 3 stars, 3 being the best experience).
12. **100%** stated they would like to see the program continue.

Because the media are good at filling our lives with fear and uncertainty, many people are scared at the thought of entering a prison. We have been safely entering prisons for decades and we come right back out again.

What drives us is the fact most people in prison were victims too. Victims of things unreported but they unfortunately act out and repeat the cycle. We are looking for 'circuit breakers' who care enough to reach out and befriend those who only know their 'kind of' friends who are mostly drug addicts – not 'straitoes'

The characteristics **we are looking for** in an in-prison volunteer are;

- 1. Good Listener**
- 2. Non-judgmental**
- 3. Accountable**
- 4. Team Player**
- 5. FAT – Faithful, Available and Teachable.**

Second Chances Mentoring Camps Return in 2021

Like the rest of the community, we needed to cease our regular activities and this included nine **Mentoring Camps** throughout 2020. We did not hold one camp for children under 16 in 2020 except for retreats for young adults in the 'Getting Ready for Take Off' program.

But we shall return.....We are in the midst of planning one Teen Girls

camp, one Teen Boys camp plus a primary age camp all three prior to June 30.

The good news is we still have funds to support both Teen Mentoring camps but the one primary age camp is not fully supported yet.

You can make an unbelievable difference in the life of a traumatised and insecure child of a prisoner, by

providing part or full sponsorship. This might be their first camp ever! We've been in this space for over a decade and as a result we are still working with them even into their youth and adulthood. We've been watching them grow through schooling and employment but the relationship starts with that first camp experience. Will you help us this year help a first time camper?
