The Board of Second Chances SA posthumously awarded the late Geoff Glanville, Life Membership of Second Chances SA (SCSA) as nominated by Lee Sando. Helen Glanville accepted the life membership on Geoff's behalf.

Geoff devoted nearly forty years of his life to supporting prisoners both incarcerated and on their release. His passion, life experiences, tenacity, commitment and faith enabled many prisoners to receive a 'second chance.'

A true indication of Geoff's devotion and commitment to prisoners and their rehabilitation was he only received fuel costs, a mobile phone and a vehicle to visit prisoners and churches to preach.

One prisoner wrote, "I will always remember Geoff as a man who trusted and believed in me even though I was in the wrong or in crisis. He was a true friend that had my back and the backs of many prisoners in SA...Geoff's lead to give himself and others a 'second chance' in life after crime, is an absolute inspiration to me and I will always look up to Geoff as an example of what I want to achieve in my life."


