Imagine as a child not having seen your mother for six months until your auntie takes you to the annual children's Christmas party at the Adelaide Women's Prison?

This is the story of two brothers aged 12 and 13 years. They were super excited to see her as it had been way too long for them. In fact, one boy misses his mum so much he wears her beanie all the time. The only communication they have had with their mum has been through phone calls.

As no one can take them to the prison each week, this was a



'one-off' visit. They were extremely pleased to receive their special Christmas presents from **Christmas Angels** – all because of you the donor and Variety.

One boy received a torch and a pair of sunglasses and the other received a fancy 'fit-bit' type health watch. Mum was excited and pleased too. They shared the joy of Christmas together on the Saturday one week before Christmas day. Thank you to every donor who has made such joy possible. This is the magic of Christmas Angels.

Becoming a Friend

As the years pass us by, it becomes apparent how easy it is to become isolated and disconnected from our previous networks and family.

When our children are still living at home, we know their friends and contacts at their sporting clubs and youth groups. But when they leave home those contacts diminish.

When we lose a close family member, it can mean our opportunities to network socially can be reduced.

For those of us who are fortunate to have loving family members and friends, we don't realise how blessed we are until they are gone.

Imagine not having a family in your start to life. Imagine having

difficulty making friends at school. Imagine not having at least one loving caregiver or guardian.

Then you make a series of poor choices and the only 'friends' you have are not good for you and they lead you into an anti-social lifestyle and criminal behaviour.

When you're a prisoner you become rejected by society and disconnected from your family due to absence.

Who wants to befriend a prisoner? We all need supportive friends and networks to move forward and live a balanced life. When you lose those networks you can become a lonely 'shut-in'. Spare a thought for those who never had a good start and now need to be understood and

supported to succeed when they return back into the community.

Criminologists say a former prisoner needs to be surrounded by people who believe they can change. Will you be one of those supporting people? You can, when you partner with us as we recruit and train community volunteers to do just that.

Family Emergency Tent Upgrade

We know just how scarce accommodation can be. We were introduced to a family of three by a concerned neighbour. When we were able to enter the back vard of a 'friend's' property, what we came across was extremely disturbing.

A mother with two teenage children were made homeless when the landlord decided to sell her home. She was desperate and the only 'roof' she could find at the time was a flimsy small tent set up in the backyard of a friend.

As soon as we saw what she and her children were enduring, we moved in to improve her situation. While it is not their long term home, they now have a much larger tent with partitions for privacy, a bar fridge for food, an annex for sitting outside in shelter and height so they can walk in and stand rather than crawling in to bed in the dark. We provided the lighting they needed too.

While the yard and tent were set up we booked accommodation for two nights at the Marion Holiday Park.

We continue to advocate for them with housing providers for a suitable home.

Since then mother and daughter attended the custom designed camp with several other mothers and daughters. This gave them some respite together and some real quality time to enhance the bond between them.

Mum now has her eyes on some study and her daughter is more committed to her schoolwork.
