Navigating Challenges

Have you ever felt the odds were against you? Your goals and desires too ambitious so you took a backward step? At Second Chances SA we have more challenges than we want or need. Just when we think we've made some progress, another challenge raises its ugly head catching us off guard.

We are buoyed by three sources of income. **Firstly, donors** who give generously, but like everyone else the challenges of keeping up with the cost of living, increased insurance premiums, increased fuel and rent is never ending for everyone and for charities. **Secondly**, we raise independent income through our social enterprises at our **Op Shop and Furniture Warehouse**. When external and internal factors impact our regular way of operating, we know it at the point of sale. For

example, there is a shortage of housing stock for the homeless and victims of domestic violence, **the demand for our furniture packages has slumped to an all-time low. It's called the 'knock-on' effect.** Thirdly, we receive some government funding for the children of prisoners program, GoActive Family Support. We have this contract till June 2025. This does not cover any operational costs with other programs.

The Board made the courageous decision last year to close our Eastwood administration offices and staff are using their home offices to work and communicate. While this has been a cost saving, it has not caught up with the Furniture Warehouse revenue loss of 30% experienced in the period July – December 2023. **Things can change quickly in six months.** Our net profits are down by 47% due

to rising rents, utilities, insurances, and fuel costs. **Later this year the government's T2D (Torrens to Darlinghurst) project on South Road, requires our Furniture Warehouse to be acquired so we are forced to relocate, and we all know there are costs associated with moving.**

While we need to operate by faith, we also need to be realistic. The Board has some serious decisions to make. If you like navigating challenges or know some business minded people who like to rescue struggling charities by flipping negatives into positives, then we would welcome your expertise.

Christmas Boxes



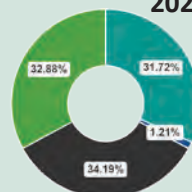
A big thank you to **LIFE Adelaide Church** who for 10 years have given hope through Christmas Boxes full of lovely Christmas goodies.

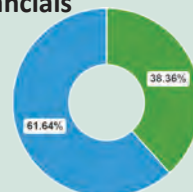
Staff Kim and Fiona personally delivered these to needy families who we've come to know through supporting their children to stay in school to finish their education.

There is nothing more gratifying to see young potential leaders emerge and develop to influence their peers for good. We've had the privilege of running, **Never too Young to Lead** retreats which focus on building up young people to rise to their potential in leadership.

*Craig is one young man who was referred to us by another agency. He was 19 at the time. At the end of the training retreat, he was awarded with a Leadership Certificate, First Aid Kit and chocolates for his outstanding leadership qualities. He managed to gain a good training apprenticeship but owing to his mother's sickness he opted to stay at home and look after her. He is a selfless and humble, a good listener and a silent observer with

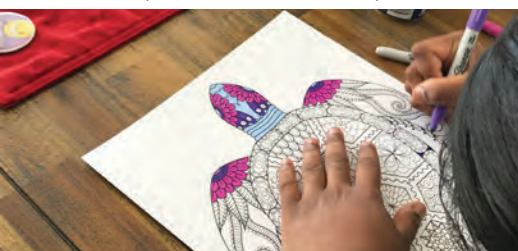
a servant's heart. Despite having a dad in prison and a mother with ongoing illness, Craig volunteered as an assistant leader at the **Teen Boys Mentoring Camp** in October and more recently at the Family camp supporting a large aboriginal family. He is currently aiming to get his driver's licence to help him gain employment again. We are planning to give more leadership opportunities to Craig at GoActive Mentoring Camps in the future.



A young emerging female leader is *Joanne who also attended the **Never too Young to Lead** leader's training retreat in September 2023. She also attended the **Never too Young to Lead** retreat. Despite having a dad who is a repeat offender in and out of prison, she was determined and persisted to finish Year 12. She was part of the leadership team for the Teen Girls Mentoring camp in November 2023 at Mannum. Her leadership qualities include being humble, a good listener with a giving heart. In support of Joanne and in the absence of her parents, both staff members Kim and Fiona, attended her Year 12 Graduation ceremony. She is currently studying Foundation Studies at Flinders University.

GoActive Mentoring Camps - Strengthening Families
